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Tax attorney active in tax litigation, including real-property tax appeals; former member of Hawaii State Tax Review Commission; member of Tax Foundation of Hawaii and of Historic Hawaii Foundation Executive Committee; current president of Downtown Improvement Association.

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Recently served as Visiting Professor of Economics at the University of Hawaii at Manoa; was a consultant for the Hawaii State Tax Review Commission; has published numerous articles in the areas of taxation and economic development; consulting work includes analyzing public policy issues for six states and eight countries.

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B.A. with highest honors in economics from the University of Hawaii in 1968 and Ph.D. in economics from Stanford University in 1973; published extensively and taught graduate and undergraduate courses in labor economics, public finance and urban economics.
